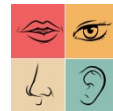
economy to social welfare [an extract from their own website, east-sussex-lieutenancy.org.uk].

Monday Club



This year the Robertsbridge Monday Lunch Club for seniors celebrated its 30th anniversary. It rapidly grew to being an important weekly event for many senior citizens in the village, who otherwise might not have too much social interaction. The scope of the club soon became more than just lunch, with occasional outings, visiting speakers and entertainers and exercise classes, plus an occasional visit from a chiropodist. Members presently pay just £7 per visit, which includes lunch and all activities.

To keep the club thriving, volunteers are required for various tasks such as setting up tables and chairs, preparing cups of tea as well as serving food, organising functions, cleaning up afterwards and – where necessary – providing and/or organising transport.

Anyone can help in one role or another as the roles are varied. The club meets every Monday, apart from Bank Holidays, but volunteers do not have to commit to every week. If you think you might be able to help, as a volunteer do pop along one Monday or phone 880511 or 880254 for more information.

There has been a gradual reduction in numbers attending; there must be many older residents of the village who would benefit from meeting others each week. If you know someone who would benefit please encourage him or her to go along.
